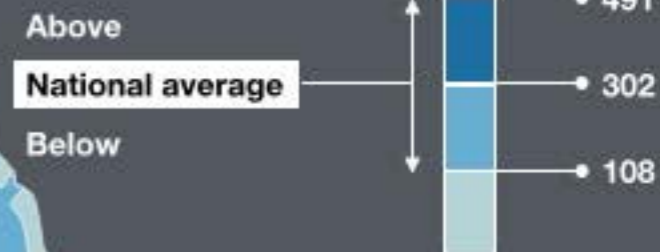

66% of Mexicans live in states with police forces lower than the national average.

The Challenge

Trust in authorities, in particular police, is a key driver for a permanent rule of law.

Among the challenges that Mexico has both at the local and the federal levels is building capable and trustable police forces and **increasing the quality and skills of the law enforcement personnel.**

On the other side, it is also a matter of quantity. According to data from the United Nations, the average police force rate is around 328 per 100,000 population and Mexico has 355 if all forces are counted (i.e. Federal Police, Gendarmerie, and other special forces plus local agencies).

However, at the local level, the situation is neither homogeneous nor encouraging. **The national average is 302 policemen. Only 9 states have a rate higher than the national average, whereas 3 states have less than 108 police forces per 100,000 population.**

Methodological notes:

- For the heat map, the thresholds for each segment were decided according to the standard deviation from the national average. The source for all the information was the Sistema Nacional de Seguridad Pública.
